MEM-259**Specificity:**
The antibody reacts with CD63 antigen (Melanoma 1 antigen), a glycoprotein of 40-60 kDa belonging to tetraspans family (TM4SF). CD63 is intracellular lysosomal/endosomal/granule protein that is translocated to cell surface upon activation of platelets, endothelial cells, and granulocytes (activation marker). CD63 is also expressed on monocytes/macro-phages and endothelium. Its cellular function has not been exactly elucidated. CD63 is thought to be associated with the early stages of melanoma tumor progression (in regulation of motility and adhesion of melanoma cells).**Isotype subclass:**
Mouse IgG1**Form:**
The purified antibody is conjugated with Fluorescein isothiocyanate (FITC) under optimum conditions. The reagent is free of unconjugated FITC and adjusted for direct use. No reconstitution is necessary.**Physical state:** Liquid**Buffer/Additives/Preservative:** PBS containing BSA and 15 mM sodium azide (pH 7.4)**Expiration date:** The reagent is stable until the expiry date stated on the vial label**Storage conditions:** Store at 4 °C. Do not freeze. Avoid prolonged exposure to light.**Application:**
